Progress From 2015 Results to 2016 Results

A significant amount of work to close the gaps of DS against non-DS has been undertaken, and whilst the performance of DS continues to be below that of their non-DS peers, as can be seen in the like-for-like measures (below) and the gap in the performance of Disadvantaged Students in MFG against those non-DS nationally is significantly closing for 5A*-CEM, Basics, 3 and 4 LOP in English and 4 LOP in maths ¹. Whilst the gap in 3LoP in maths has widened the gap remains smaller than three years ago.

The curriculum followed by this year group was a significant contributory factor to the low Progress 8 figure. Traditionally the curriculum was planned to ensure students secured post 16 pathways and use the expertise and successes of the Academy's Design Technology 'specialism'; the success of this is evidenced in the annual positive EET figures. The Academy

has successfully been 'growing out' the historic curriculum to ensure that more students are taking EBAC subjects.

Like the rest of the Academy the empty EBacc buckets also had a bearing on the Progress 8 performance of Disadvantaged Students. In addition to this, of the ten students attending Alternative Provision (mentioned above), nine were Disadvantaged. The impact of both of these can be seen below:
