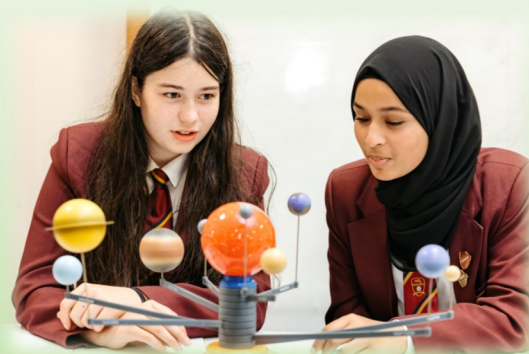

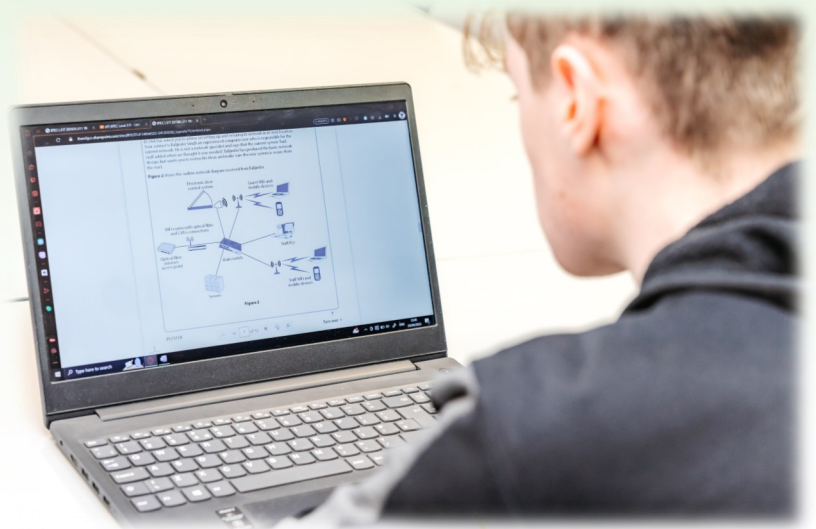


**STEM and Robotics Club—3.05pm—3.45pm—Mr Padgett—Y03—Years 7, 8 & 9—
