

BTEC HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE (DIPLOMA)

OVERVIEW

This course has been specifically designed to prepare students who wish to pursue a career in any of the health or social care services. Students will learn about the structure and provision of health and social care services within England in addition to investigating the many different roles available within the sector. There is also a focus on individuals and the different care needs that they have at different times throughout their lives.

The course encompasses academic challenge and rigor through examination and coursework. Although work placement is no longer a compulsory element of the course, students are actively encouraged to seek some practical high-quality voluntary work placement. This provides them with invaluable knowledge and experience of working in the Health and Social Care sector.


